



CGS CATECHISTS NEEDED—Catechesis of The Good Shepherd (CGS) is a common religious education experience involving children and specially trained adults in which the religious values of childhood, primarily those values of contemplation and enjoyment of God, are predominant. This experience is shared in a place particularly prepared for the religious life of children called the Atrium. We welcome children from 3 to 12 years old (end of sixth grade). Catechists foster religious values of childhood. For that you will need to attend a Faith Formation course to help our children to enter contemplation and enjoyment of God at their stages of development. There is a course for catechists at the beginning of June and we need to have the new catechists enrolled by the first week of May. From Fr. Stan-Holy Thursday Reception of the Eucharist

On Holy Thursday, the day we celebrate the institution of the Priesthood and the Eucharist at the Last Supper, we will have the distribution of the Holy Eucharist under both species. Although reception of the Eucharist under both species represents the fullness of the sign of the sacrament, the entire Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus is present in the reception of the Sacred Host. No one (with the exception of the celebrant) is 'required' to receive under both species.

A reminder about how to receive the Precious Blood—The reception of the Precious Blood will be by consuming directly from the chalice and not by personal intinction (dipping the Sacred Host into the Precious Blood). We always come to receive the Eucharist and never to take the Eucharist.

I heartily encourage everyone to participate fully in the beautiful sacred liturgies this week. And may this truly be a Holy Week for you and your families.

From the Tastor's Desk



We have just heard the Greatest Story ever told - everything but the last chapter, of course. And our hearts break for what Jesus had to go through. Here was an innocent man, our God in fact, being mistreated and falsely accused and mocked and it's hard to even describe the rest. Many of us would trade places with anyone else on this earth before we would trade places with Jesus. And He did it all for us. And for no other reason than He loves us.

Each of us share and participate in this same story in a certain sense. The pattern we see in this story is also the pattern of every human life. The hopes, the dreams, the promise, the possibilities. The joys. and then the disappointments, the sorrow, the pain, the dreams unfulfilled, the heartache. And then the next chapter, whatever that may be; a chapter which has yet to unfold, yet to be realized, yet to be discovered. That is the journey we call life - a journey of ups and downs, good and bad, joys and sorrows.

My friends, we are on the threshold on the holiest week of the year. Many of us want to jump ahead to Easter, jump ahead to the end of the story, jump ahead to the fulfillment of God's promise for each of us.

And yet, it can't be that way. The story we just heard shows us that clearly. And so, we are invited to wait. We are invited to trust. We are invited to take Jesus' hand.

And we are invited to walk - walk with Jesus wherever He leads. Even if it means we walk with Him into the holy city. Even if it means we walk with Him into the upper room and into the garden. Even if it means we stand hand in hand with Him before Pilate. Even if it means we climb that hill with Him - not in fear and despair, but in hope - a hope that says tomorrow can be better than today - We can be better the we are. Who or what we were yesterday doesn't matter. Who we want to be today is what matters. But it's up to us, with God's help, of course.

And it all starts with a single step, not alone - but with Jesus. Let us make that sacred walk this week.
