



If you have ever tried to understand what we mean when we say that Jesus laid down his life for us, you know that it can be difficult. And if you've ever tried to actually explain it to others, you know that putting it into words can even be more difficult. Sometimes, we do our best to come up with simple sentences that 'say it all,' especially when it comes to our children. I remember as a young person being told things such as 'Jesus died so that our sins could be forgiven,' or 'Jesus died to save us,' or 'Jesus died for you and me' or one of my favorites, 'Jesus died to open up the gates of heaven.' And honestly, I can't disagree with any of these statements. Our faith teaches us those very things. Yet, I would argue that each of them, in its own way, focuses almost exclusively on the afterlife, on the life we hope to live eternally with God after we have died. This seems to be confirmed by what Jesus says in today's gospel passage, '...whoever eats this bread will live forever ... ?

And so it seems wise and faithful to keep our eyes fixed on the prize (for lack of a better word), fixed on our sincere hope to be with God forever after our relatively short earthly lives have ended. Yet, I think it's important that we see the laying down of Jesus' life as something that has more implications for us than simply a reward for us at some point in the future. Jesus himself adds, '...and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world...'

Jesus gave his flesh...gave his very self in love....to give life to the world....not to provide life at some point in the future, but to shower it upon us right now, in this time and place, to me and to you. Jesus shared his life with the world in a perfect way 2,000 years ago, and he continues to do so; completely, continually, and without limit. And why? Why does Jesus keep pouring his life into the world? Why does he give himself to us as real food in the Eucharist? Simply, so that we can be fully alive; fully transformed by his love and mercy and compassion and generosity; that is, by his very life poured out for us and into each of us.

And so, Jesus gives us his flesh as real food for the journey so that we in turn can become the Body of Christ; and in imitation of him, give our flesh, lay down our lives, for the life of the world. Think about that for a second. God gave his life so that we might have life. And now he asks us to give our lives to and for others in precisely the same way, unconditionally.

And so, when we come forward to receive the sacred Body and Blood of Our Lord, let us be sure that we are giving something at the same time—our very selves. And may we, like Jesus, pledge to give our flesh for the life of the world; not superficially or in limited or timid or measured or conditional ways, but completely, to every person in every situation.

The Lord Jesus is the Bread of Life. Let us never forget that. And may our sharing in the Eucharist, help us to be lifegivers too.
