Today we gather to celebrate the feast of the Holy Family, a day in which we recognize and give thanks to God for the beautiful, loving example shown us by Mary, Joseph and Jesus. But one thing we should not do is overromanticize the lives they led. Their lives were anything but easy. They had struggles. They must have certainly wondered whether they understood their call from God (through angels) correctly. They had more than their fair share of sorrow and heartache and 'What does this all mean?' moments. Simeon, in his heartfelt words at the Presentation prophesied that 'and you yourself a sword will pierce.' In today's gospel of the finding in the Temple, we hear a frustrated, worried Mary saying, 'Son, why have you done this to us?' and Jesus responds by saying something about His need to be in His Father's House.

There is no doubt that they could ever have imagined, or chosen, that way the events surrounding the life of their Son would play out. The ridicule He faced. The suspicion He was under. The friends He probably lost. And of course, the violence; resulting in a death we would not wish on our worst enemy. No, life for the Holy Family was almost certainly filled with struggle, sorrow and confusion; not unlike ours at times. I guess you could say that we, and they most certainly, make plans and well, life happens.

And so, maybe in the Holy Family we can find a certain kind of hope; that in the messiness of life, amidst the difficulties and curveballs and disappointments, love and faithfulness can triumph over all that. This hope in the Lord and in his promises can give us strength to keep moving down the path to greater and greater holiness and peace; even when our lives might feel as if they are coming apart at the seams. You see, in the end, the depth of Jesus' love and his willingness to remain faithful to his Father no matter what, won eternal victory over every sorrow and every disappointment and every struggle; even over death itself. For those who loved Jesus it must have seemed as though their world was crashing down around them and well, new life happened; and the world, and we, were never the same again.

Thank you Joseph, for your compassion and understanding and basic decency. Thank you Mary for saying yes to the most outrageous and awe-inspiring request a human being ever received. And thank you Jesus for, well.... everything.
