



From the Pastor's Desk



Today's readings challenge us look more deeply at faithfulness and embrace it with both joy and firm resolve. Mary and Joseph, raised in the tradition of Judaism, set out to Jerusalem to do what most Jews at the time would have done, take the newborn Jesus to the Temple to present him to the Lord, consecrate him to God and offer sacrifice. The text tells us that they did this 'in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord.'

We could just leave it at that and be satisfied to think of faithfulness as obedience to God's laws and adherence to tradition, both of which are worthy in themselves. But what unfolds in the Temple helps us to look a little deeper. Two figures, Simeon and Anna, respond to this young family in ways that reveal God's faithfulness to Israel in the birth of Jesus, while illustrating their own faithfulness.

What we see in the Gospel are two elderly people who come to the Temple daily, not out of habit but with the anticipation of witnessing God's unfolding plan. Their devotion takes the form of active waiting, which means they show up with open eyes and minds and hearts.

Simeon is a man who is holding off death until he can see that God's promised consolation for Israel is no longer on the distant horizon but right before his eyes, With the child in his arms, he proclaims 'My eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples.'

We also see the widow Anna, who apparently stayed in the Temple precincts, perhaps for safety after her husband had died. She is known as a prophetess, which means she was recognized as speaking for God. Her active waiting involves fasting and prayer, a way of readying herself for God's revelation of salvation.

Both of these figures show us how God calls forth exemplary faithfulness from ordinary people. Simeon and Anna are seen in our own parish in those who faithfully show up with anticipation. These people minister in our midst as catechists and lectors. They keep the grounds beautiful and fix what is broken. They minister to the sick and the homebound. They put faith into action on behalf of those who are in need of food or assistance. They pay attention to divisions and help empower those in isolation. Their prayer and service readies them to see God at work in our midst, and hopefully emulate Anna and speak of God's presence to all of us, bearing witness to God's merciful goodness on our behalf.

Each one of us can be an Anna or a Simeon by always looking for the signs of God's presence right in our ordinary lives.
