

Sometimes I think we forget that our faith is founded on a person. 'Forget' may not be the most precise word but this is what I mean. Christianity is not just a philosophy. It is not just a collection of people who say, 'Try to be nice to people and try not to do anything too bad.' No one needs religion to come up with that brilliant insight. And Christianity does not draw its identity simply because we agree on the Name we invoke when we need something.

Rather Christianity is founded, is built, is anchored, rests, on a person; the person of Jesus; the Word made Flesh; our God who has visited his people and who continues to dwell among us through his Holy Spirit. Jesus isn't just the foundation of our religion; He is the foundation of our very lives, of our very beings. Jesus is our God and therefore He deserves our everything.

And that's not easy and you know that. It is so much easier to.....Acknowledge Jesus as Lord...than it is to allow Him to be Lord of our life. It is so much easier to..... Turn to Him in need...than it is to turn to Him when we are trying to decide whether to be generous with someone, or whether to forgive someone, or whether we need to reach out to someone who is lonely or forgotten. It is so much easier to..... Simply do what we want or what works for us, than it is to truly wonder whether or not Jesus would be ok with it. It is so much easier to..... Give Jesus a little... than it is to give Jesus a lot.

The fact is that our faith is founded on the person of Jesus...our God in the flesh...means that we really can't use the excuse 'Well, who can say what God wants of me? Who can say what God expects me to say or do? It is anybody's guess. I'm not going to worry about it'. That just seems like a license to do whatever we want to do. The beauty and the challenge of Christianity is that we actually have a concrete, real-life person we can look to guide us and shape our thoughts and actions. We aren't in the dark. Jesus illuminates for us the way to live, the way to see, the way to think and the way to be. Now, it's true that we don't (and can't) know everything about Jesus. That would be impossible. Yet, we do know so many things about Him. We know what He was about. We know what He stood for. We know whom He identified with. We know some of the stories He told that revealed deep truths. We know about His many healings, and His preaching, and His comforting of the sorrowful, and His reaching out to the lost and forgotten, and His forgiving of those who wronged him. This is our example. This is our calling. This is our mission. This is our God to whom we owe everything.

Our faith is not founded on a few wise sayings or a few moral statements. It is founded on a person. May He be the one we truly adore, worship, follow, (and maybe most importantly) imitate.
