IMPORTANT NOTICE—The yellow and green receptacles for collecting recyclable paper (behind the Rectory) have been permanently removed from the church campus. Over the past several years, the company responsible for emptying the bins has changed hands several times and each new company has become less and less responsive to repeated requests to have them emptied on a timely basis. This would cause them to be filled to overflowing, with the wind blowing loose papers out across the parking lot and lawn. Also, other types of non-recyclable trash have been placed in them, such as cardboard boxes and Styrofoam packing materials. While there is no cost to the parish to offer this service, there is also no financial benefit for us to keep them. Other locations in the area that still have the containers are Robeson Lutheran Church and St. Peter's Catholic Church on Route 82 in Coatesville (Chester County). Please note they only accept recyclable paper and <u>no</u> cardboard boxes or any other kind of trash.

Today's gospel comes from the 17th Chapter of St. John and is also known as 'Jesus' prayer'. It is a powerful message to all of us. Often when we hear the gospel and the promises Jesus makes to His disciples, we can wonder if Jesus ever actually thought about us specifically as well.

Jesus says, 'I pray for not only them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word.' It makes a lot of difference to know that Jesus thought of us, that He had us in mind when He died for us, and that He actually prayed for us.

And what was it that Jesus prayed for, for you and I? It's not that we become the wealthiest or healthiest or wisest. Jesus prays that we may all be one.

This oneness or unity that Jesus prays for has both a vertical and a horizontal dimension. This is not unlike the symbol of our salvation in the cross itself.

That intimate and eternal bond which unites the Father, Son and Holy Spirit is the very bond that unites us with God and with each other. Jesus clearly describes this unity when He says, 'that the love with which you, Father, loved me may be in them and I in them.'

The very core of our existence in our life as a Christian is the 'I' in them.' Nowhere is Jesus' prayer better answered for Him and for us than as we celebrate the Eucharist. As we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus, we celebrate the Jesus in me and Jesus is in us, and we are indeed one with Jesus and one another.

Our challenge, our mission and our prayer is to extend this unity everyday with everyone we encounter, whether at work or school, with family or friends, and especially with our loving God.

May we never for a moment feel unloved, because through His sacrifice for us, Jesus' prayer has been answered; He is with us and He is in us.
