I wonder what the disciples of thought as Jesus affirmed the poor woman for putting in a couple of coins worth virtually nothing. Were they surprised? Were they ashamed? Were they pleased? Were they confused? We really can't know for sure. What we do know is that Jesus was pointing out an important truth to them, one that can sometimes be difficult to hear and embrace. By telling them that the woman had given more than any of the rich people, he seems to have been telling them that true giving costs something. the widow had given the most because it cost her the most.

We only have to look at the life of Jesus to see that true giving involves real sacrifice. God gave himself to us in a perfect, intimate, tangible way in the person of his Son, and it cost him everything; his very life outpoured for the salvation of the whole world. And as a disciple of the Lord, God asks the same of us; asks that we give our entire selves; everything we have and are; poured out for the sake of others. He wants us to give as the poor widow in today's gospel story gave, from our want and not our excess. But it's not easy. A life of true faith never is.

To give God everything; every word, thought and action; to give back to Him every minute of every day and everything we own; to make Him the center of our lives and the motivation for everything we do, can seem to be an impossible task. And as a result, we can often become paralyzed into doing relatively little.

But maybe, today's Gospel story can help us take steps in that direction. A good place to start might be this—maybe we should strive to make sure that our giving truly costs us something, make sure that each time we give, we are truly making a sacrifice of some kind, make sure that we are truly denying ourselves something so that someone else may benefit. (For example; instead of going out for dinner, giving that money to charity; instead of playing golf, help a friend who needs you, take the money you use for recreation and use as much to help another in need.)

These are just a few examples. In reality, there are all sorts of small opportunities that come our way in which we can give without counting the cost, without wondering what's in it for me, without trying to make our giving the least painful or inconvenient it can be. Rather, each time we give in such a way that is actually costs us something, in such a way that we are really sacrificing something of ourselves for the sake of someone else, we grow a little closer to our God, and rest a little more assuredly and peacefully in His loving embrace; our incredible God who loves us more than we can ever imagine, and who blesses us in ways that cannot be counted.

And that's a pretty good place to be.
