Because this is the last Sunday of the Church Year and the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, we are asked to reflect on the last things of our lives - our life, death, and the promise of eternal life in the reign of God.

The reign of Christ will include those who feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, give clothes to the naked, visit the sick and imprisoned, and show hospitality to the stranger. This reign of Christ will probably also include all those who have been starving for emotional and spiritual support; starving for acceptance and friendship; starving for forgiveness and understanding. Our support for these would be an effective means of feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, and showing hospitality to the stranger.

The last Sunday of the Church Year is an important time for giving thanks for what we have received throughout this past year and throughout our lives. At the Last Supper, the night before he died, Jesus gave thanks with the first Holy Eucharist. For what can we give thanks this Sunday? Give thanks for the gift of life and the gift of new life in baptism. Give thanks for each of us being unique and special - the very best of God's creation. Give thanks for our families, communities, and friends. Give thanks for the gift of faith by which we are drawn out of darkness into God's marvelous light and eternal life. Give thanks for our particular calling in life by which we bear fruit. Give thanks for those around us—for all who are easy to love, those in need of our love, and even for those not so easy to love. Give thanks for Christ, our loving and merciful sovereign.

Our world is imperfect. We are imperfect. We have to keep moving away from sin. We have to keep working for justice and peace in the world. But the Solemnity of Christ the King means that one day all things will be clear. There will be an end to confusion, hatred, and failure. Life does have a direction, even though we might not always see it. But that direction clearly needs to be towards God.

On this last Sunday of the Church Year, the liturgy and our faith point us to a God who cares, who is Almighty, who is ruler, and who invites us to be part of God's everlasting and Majestic reign. We are to lift our eyes to God and see descend from that infinite majesty a ray of glory on those here on earth. That ray of glory is Jesus Christ. May we always honor our king, listening to the voice of Christ, in our worship and through our service to one another. God bless you, Fr. Stan.
