



From the Pastor's Desk



All of the readings this weekend warn of self-deception, especially in terms of divine law and our conventional relationship with God.

No one should ever ignore the importance of God's laws. Just and moral laws are gifts as they set the parameters for good relationships among people. Though we may not refer to it as law, we know that in any good relationship there are rules which govern our behavior.

For example, we may not speak of the formal laws of marriage, but the covenant of marriage calls spouses to be faithful, to support each other and to be attentive to the needs of one another and the family as well. Unfaithfulness, disregard and abuse are outside the parameters of the commitment of married life and love.

Just as human law guides our earthly relationships, obedience to God's law should be seen as expressing our care and concern for our relationship with God.

In our 1st Reading, Moses talks about observing the divine law; don't add to it or subtract from it. Obedience to the law will bring you life and prosperity in the Promised Land and will bring them the greatest reputation for wisdom and understanding.

Divine Law as taught by Jesus, teaches us about relationships with God and one another. Both the Letter of St. James and our Gospel show the varieties of self-deception that we can fall into.

The major principle in the Letter to St. James is that acceptance of the Gospel means submission to it in our conduct. Faith makes moral demands and requires us to be doers, not just hearers of the Word. Our proper respect and love of God will show itself in works of charity to the needy and our internal commitment to a way of life free from an arbitrary morality.

In the Gospel, the Pharisees heard God's law, put it into action, but they were just going through the motions. They were concerned with their actions and felt that actions alone were justified, but there was no change in their interior disposition. Their hands were clean, but what about their hearts and mind and soul? 'From within people, from their hearts come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy. blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and defile.'

Mark Twain once said 'It's not the part of the Bible I fail to understand that troubles me, it's the part I do understand'. Although compliance to God's laws may at times seem difficult, this difficulty expresses that reality that all good relationships require work, devotion, and faithfulness.

All that we do should be motivated by our love for God and each other, even when difficult. Such motivation becomes a sign of our love and commitment to God and neighbor. The reality of love reciprocated, according to the law of God, is a gift which is certainly worth the work and effort involved. This gift, is the real gift that keeps on giving.
