I don't have to tell you that we live in a competitive world. We seem to be constantly competing for all sorts of things; jobs and promotions, attention and affirmation, power and prestige, even love and affection and companionship. And in many of these areas of life there seems to be a 'winner' and a 'loser.' And because of that perception, we sometimes find ourselves acting in harmful, unjust, or less-thanhonorable ways.

'Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us.'

This type of thinking, evidently, is nothing new. John, in speaking on behalf of himself and other followers of Jesus, is not happy that someone outside their group is driving out demons in Jesus' name. Maybe he's afraid that they will lose some followers. Maybe he's afraid that they will get confused and be led astray. Maybe he is simply full of pride. Or maybe, he just doesn't like the other person. His motives aren't exactly clear from the text. But one thing apparently is not in dispute; the person in question was indeed driving out demons. Jesus will have none of John's pettiness. He tells him, 'Do not prevent him.... For whoever is not against us is for us.'

In other words, Jesus is encouraging John to 'affirm' the 'good,' wherever he finds it. He does not want John to see the good deeds of others as some sort of threat to them or their mission. Jesus seems to be saying that goodness is just that, good. Goodness is holy, goodness is from God; and therefore it should be acknowledged and affirmed and embraced wherever and in whomever his disciples find it. When they see something good or decent or helpful or loving in another or being done by another, they should simply rejoice in it; not try to find fault with it or be suspicious of it or undermine it in some way.

The moral of the story is this; Life is not a win-lose situation; it's a win-win. When we affirm the good wherever we find it, we are encouraging others to continue doing the right thing, continue living in such a way as to help the world become the beautiful place God created it to be. In other words, when we build up, instead of tearing down, when we point out and embrace the good in each person we meet and the situations in which we find ourselves, everyone wins; we win, they win, the world wins. So let's stop putting others down. Let's stop trying to diminish or dismiss others. Let's stop trying to demonize those with whom we disagree, or those we feel threatened by. Rather, let's acknowledge and affirm every good thing we come across. The only things we stand to lose are our envy and our selfcenteredness. And that's good for everybody.
