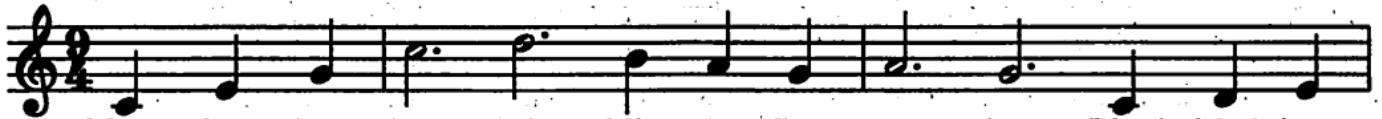

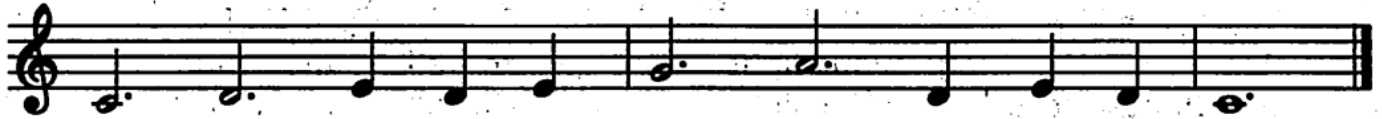

## Serran Prayer for Vocations


